NOTICE OF RACE

1 RULES

- 1.1 The regatta will be governed by the rules as defined in *The Racing Rules of Sailing*.
- 1.2 The Yachting New Zealand Safety Regulations Part IV shall apply.
- 1.3 Racing rule(s) 35, 40 will be changed as follows:
 - Rule 35 will be changed to state that boats still racing but failing to finish within 20 minutes after the first boat sails the course and finishes will be scored “did not finish” DNF.
 - Rule 35 will further be changed to state that a boat starting later than 4 minutes after her starting signal will be scored Did Not Start, DNS
 - Rule 40 will be changed to require personal floatation devices to be worn at all times while afloat,
 - The changes will appear in full in the Sailing Instructions. The Sailing Instructions may also change other racing rules.
- 1.4 The sailing instructions will consist of the instructions in RRS Appendix S, Standard Sailing Instructions, and supplementary sailing instructions that will be on the official notice board located at <https://www.ltyc.org.nz/page/594741>
- 1.5 Appendix T, Arbitration, will apply.

3 COMMUNICATION

3.1 The online official notice board is located at <https://www.ltyc.org.nz/page/594741>

3.2 All boats shall carry a VHF radio capable of communicating on 16 & 77. List channels that may be used. Include any safety or hailing channels specified by local regulations.

3.3 On the water, the race committee will make courtesy broadcasts to competitors on VHF radio. The channel will be stated in the SIs.

3.4 From the first warning signal until the end of the last race of the day, except in an emergency, a boat shall not make voice or data transmissions and shall not receive voice or data communication that is not available to all boats.

4 ELIGIBILITY AND ENTRY

4.1 The event is open to all Sports Boats.

4.2 Entries will open 1 November 2020. Eligible boats may enter by completing the application form accessed through the Lake Taupo Yacht Club website, or by following this link, and completing payment of the appropriate entry fee by the closing date for entries, which is Tuesday 9 November 2021.

4.3 Late entries will be accepted until 0900 hrs on Saturday 13 November 2021 at the discretion of the organising authority;

4.4 To be eligible to compete in this event each competitor and crew member shall be a financial member of a club recognised by the Yachting New Zealand. Proof of affiliated club membership may be requested at registration.

5 FEES

5.1 The entry fee for this event is \$110. Entries completed by the closing date will be subject to an early bird entry fee of \$80.

5.2 Other fees:

All boats must obtain a ramp pass to launch at any of the public launching facilities. Ramp passes may be purchased from <https://ramp-permit-taupo.dia.govt.nz/>

10 EQUIPMENT INSPECTION

10.1 Each boat shall comply with RRS 78.

11 CLOTHING AND EQUIPMENT

11.1 NOT USED

12 VENUE

12.1 The regatta will be held at Lake Taupo Yacht Club, 9 Ferry Road, Taupo

12.2 The racing area will be Tapuaeharuru Bay, Lake Taupo

13 COURSES

13.1 The course(s) to be sailed will be windward leeward

13.2 The marks that may be used are cylindrical, yellow, self-inflating marks

14 PENALTY SYSTEM

14.1 Not used

14.2 RRS 44.1 is changed so that the Two-Turns Penalty is replaced by the One-Turn Penalty.

15 SCORING

15.1 5 races are required to be completed to constitute a series.

15.2 (a) When fewer than 5 races have been completed, a boat's series score will be the total of her race scores.

(b) When 5 or more races have been completed, a boat's series score will be the total of her race scores excluding her worst score.

16 SUPPORT PERSON VESSELS

16.1 Support boats are not permitted.

17 NOT USED

18 LAUNCHING

18.1 Boats shall be launched from public launching facilities. Ramp Permits are required (see 5.2).

20 HULL & EQUIPMENT CLEANING

20.1 To protect the sensitive environment of Lake Taupo, all boats and their equipment are to be cleaned before travelling to Taupo for the event.

22 RISK STATEMENT

22.1 RRS 3 states:

'The responsibility for a boat's decision to participate in a race or to continue to race is hers alone.' By participating in this event each competitor agrees and acknowledges that sailing is a potentially dangerous activity with inherent risks. These risks include strong winds and rough seas, sudden changes in weather, failure of equipment, boat handling errors, poor seamanship by other boats, loss of balance on an unstable platform and fatigue resulting in increased risk of injury. **Inherent in the sport of sailing is the risk of permanent, catastrophic injury or death by drowning, trauma, hypothermia or other causes.**

23 INSURANCE

23.1 Each participating boat shall be insured with valid third-party liability insurance with a minimum cover of \$1,000,000 per incident or the equivalent.

24 TROPHIES AND PRIZES

24.1 Regatta trophies will be awarded for 1st, 2nd and 3rd places
Spot prizes may be awarded

25 RIGHTS TO USE NAME AND LIKENESS

By participating in this event, competitors automatically grant to the Organizing Authority and the event sponsors the right, in perpetuity, to make, use, and show, at their discretion, any photography, audio and video recordings, and other reproductions of them made at the venue or on the water from the time of their arrival at the venue, until their final departure, without compensation.
